

Following a 6-year development schedule, The Masonry Society (TMS) has completed and published the 2022 edition of TMS 402/602 Building Code Requirements and Specification for Masonry Structures. This updated edition of TMS 402/602 includes numerous changes and additions such as completely revised veneer provisions that are more rationally based and a new Appendix on the use of GFRP (Glass Fiber Reinforced Polymer) reinforced masonry. These and other major changes will be reviewed in a 5-session Night School starting on October 19.

John Chrysler of the Masonry Institute of America (MIA) will be teaching the first Night School class October 19 providing an overview of the changes. We're also trying to convince John to bring this update and his teaching talents to us at the next MCAC State Meeting March 2023 in Hawaii. Stay tuned.
