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California Introduces Heat Illness Certification for Outdoor Workers

Prevention Plan Toolkit



Nearly all employers will be required to maintain a written Workplace Violence Prevention Plan (WVPP) starting July 1, 2024 as a result of <u>Senate Bill 553</u> (SB 553) signed into law last year.

While SB 553's provisions are effective July 1, 2024, it

is anticipated that Cal/OSHA will begin to focus on workplace violence prevention before the compliance deadline and has already cited employers for failing to adequately address the issue.

To get our member employers ready for these sweeping new requirements, MCAC acquired customizable templates and a PowerPoint training deck developed by legal counsel Ogletree Deakins.

California Introduces Heat Illness Certification for Outdoor Workers

February 16th was the deadline for bill introductions in the California Legislature. One of those bills, <u>AB 2264</u>, would mandate Heat Illness Prevention Certification for all outdoor workers effective July 1, 2028.



Key Highlights of AB 2264:

- **Certification Requirement:** Outdoor workers must obtain Heat Illness Certification to enhance their knowledge and awareness of preventing heatrelated issues in the workplace.
- **Certification Validity:** The certification is valid for 3 years, follows the employee in the event of a change in employers and is recognized statewide.
- **Examination Component:** To achieve certification, workers are required to pass an exam with a minimum score of 70%.
- Integration with On-the-Job Training: The certification process would be integrated into employers' on-the-job training programs.

MCAC has this bill on our radar along with several others. Stay tuned for the full report

coming soon.
