



## Cal/OSHA Revised COVID-19 Standard to be Effective January 14, 2022

At its December 16, 2021 meeting, the Cal/OSHA Standards Board updated workplace COVID rules when it adopted a revised **COVID-19 Emergency Temporary Standard (ETS)** to be **effective January 14, 2022**. Notable updates include a revised definition of acceptable face coverings and "close contact" protocols for asymptomatic vaccinated employees.

- Acceptable face coverings are now limited to surgical masks, medical procedure
  masks, voluntarily-worn respirators, or other materials consisting of, at least, twolayers through which light does not pass. This means that many of the cloth
  masks that have been used by employees will no longer be acceptable under
  this new standard.
- Employers are now required to make COVID-19 testing available at no cost and during paid time to fully vaccinated asymptomatic employees exposed to a \*"close contact."
- 3. Fully vaccinated asymptomatic employees exposed to a "close contact" must wear a mask and social distance in the workplace for 14 days following the last date of \*"close contact".

\*"Close contact" means being within six feet of a COVID-19 case for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or greater in any 24-hour period within or overlapping with the "high-risk exposure period".

Note: The California ETS does not mandate vaccinations or set forth a requirement to test in lieu of vaccination. Cal/OSHA has indicated that it will evaluate separately how to respond to a federal OSHA requirement for vaccinations in the workplace.
